Matters of Life and Death.

Perhaps there's nothing like some significant deaths to make us remember how precious, and fleeting, this gift of life is. The passing of Phyllis Furumoto and Wanja Twan during 2019 marks the end of an era in my world of Reiki; Phyllis as a teacher and friend, and Wanja as my lineage connection with Usui.

It's interesting to contemplate the excitement those early Reiki Masters' must have felt, encouraged and stimulated by Mrs Takata's 40 years of Reiki practice. Phyllis wrote about their optimism when that group met in Hawaii, and perhaps, how naively they looked to the future, not knowing that from it's humble beginnings, Reiki would become such a world-wide practice.



Born in 1948, Phyllis was introduced to Reiki by her grand-mother Mrs Takata She completed her master training in 1979. After being elected as Lineage Bearer in 1982, Phyllis travelled the world for nearly 40 years teaching the 'Takata' form of Reiki. Following an eight year battle with cancer, Phyllis died on 31st March, 2019



Born in Sweden in 1934, Wanja Twan moved to Canada in the 1950's. In 1978 she met Mrs Takata and completed her Reiki Master training in 1979. She then travelled around the world teaching Reiki, including in Australia in 1985 where she taught Greg Williamson (my Master teacher) She died on the 3rd of September 2019.

I met Phyllis in 1992 at her first 'Student Gathering' in Perth, I wanted to be the best teacher I could be and attended five more programs over the following years. Sometimes our relationship was a little turbulent as there were elements of her and the teachings I found difficult; in retrospect, they were mostly my issues. We ended up friends, not close friends, but friends. I only ever met Wanja once, by the time I had become a master – a part of her lineage - she had basically stopped teaching in Australia and only visited some of her students occasionally. She had a special Indian meditation teacher and that provided a firm basis for our simple connection. From all accounts, she was a remarkable person who lived an extraordinary life.
